

Are you fully aware of the impact that the Sustainable Development Commission will have on working Electricians in 2010 & 2011?

Are you a practicing 17th Edition holding Electrician, who will need to be further trained & qualified if called upon to install, commission or maintain any of the sustainable energy resources that are being set up to meet with the new requirements in the UK.

We get asked for the same advice in this area on a weekly basis... *`Is there really a call for electricians who can install photovoltaic systems yet? Which qualifications do I need if I want to install these systems? What is the difference between a Solar Power & a Photovoltaic System? Is there a Governing Body I will need to join? Will the government be paying the public for any energy generated that they do not use? Should I be pushing these systems when designing a new job? What are joint-tariff's*

The half-day Sustainable Energy Seminar sets out to inform delegates clearly and openly on the following issues:

- What the Government Agenda regarding sustainable energy entails - in simple terms.
- The actual impact this will have on the working day of a Domestic or Commercial Electrician.
- Which recognised Qualifications are required, essential &/or available.
- How complex a subject/discipline the sustainable systems are to comprehend.
- How quickly will we see work relating to sustainable energy being generated in the UK

- 12.15 - The Seminar will close – however David Tinsley, Andy Garrad & Lester Bell will be available for individual questions or advice until 1300.
